How to search for your elected officials online:

1. Go to: https://ballotpedia.org/Who_represents_me
2. Enter your home address (or the address where you are registered to vote.)
3. Enter your email address. (You can opt out of receiving update emails.)
4. Click continue.
5. All of your elected officials will be listed by category. You can click on their name and will be directed to other websites where you can learn more about the individual.

How to find and track bills on www.iga.in.gov:

1. Go to www.iga.in.gov.
2. If you know the bill name and/or number, you can search for the bill directly in the search box in the top right corner. Click on “bills” and then type the applicable information into the search box.



3. To search through all bills or to find a specific bill number, click on “legislation” in the top banner.



4. You can search legislation by bill name, legislator, or subject. You can also search for resolutions.



5. Check out the bills section by clicking on “bills” and you can see a draft of every bill being brought during the current session. Bills that are the color gray have already died. Bills that are the color blue are still active.

6. Click on a bill to read a summary (digest), the entirety of the proposed legislation, and learn about actions that have been taken on the bill. You will be able to see who authored the bill, co-authored, and sponsored the bill.

DIGEST

Supported decision making. Requires that a person who files a petition for the appointment of a guardian for an incapacitated person or minor must inform the court what less restrictive alternatives were considered or implemented and, if less restrictive alternatives were not considered or implemented, the reason for the failure to consider or implement less restrictive alternatives. Provides for the use of supported decision making agreements for adults who need support and accommodations in making, communicating, and effectuating decisions.

7. Use the panel on the left side of the screen to read the latest version, actions, amendments, committee reports, etc.
