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Executive Summary

The 2025-2027 State Plan for Independent Living (SPIL) for Indiana serves as a strategic Plan to bring together the Independent Living (IL) Network, which includes the Statewide Independent Living Council (INSILC), the Indiana Division of Disability and Rehabilitative Services (DDRS)/of the Bureau of Rehabilitation Services (BRS) as the Designated State Entity (DSE) and ten Centers for Independent Living (CILs). It designs a framework that will advance the independence of individuals with significant disabilities through collaborative effort. Together, the Independent Living Network will work toward the mission of “self-determination and full inclusion of people with disabilities through the Independent Living Philosophy.” While each partner has their own organizational and community goals, this Plan is our vehicle to collaborate to impact all individuals with disabilities in Indiana.

Indiana Statewide Independent Living Council recognizes and acknowledges the importance of being an ally in the advancement of self-determination and inclusion for all Americans, especially for those populations that experience multiple marginalization, whose intersectionality imposes increased challenges.

The World Institute on Disabilities defines multiple marginalization as: “Multiply marginalized people with disabilities are those who, in addition to being disabled, also belong to another marginalized group. This includes those who belong to marginalized genders, races, ethnicities, sexualities and/or economic backgrounds.”

Throughout this Plan, the Independent Living Network will continue efforts toward making Indiana a better state for the 1 million (1,000,000+) Hoosiers with disabilities through the provision of the five core services, and collaboration with state and community partners. Special emphasis is placed on self-advocacy, self-determination, and leadership development among our peers with disabilities.

All goals and objectives of this document are consistent with and further the purpose of Title VII, Chapter 1 of the Act. Specifically, each goal and objective works to:

- Promote the Independent Living Philosophy based on consumer control, peer support, self-help, self-determination, equal access, and individual and systems advocacy.
- Maximize the leadership, empowerment, independence, and productivity of individuals with significant disabilities; and
- Promote the integration and full inclusion of individuals with significant disabilities into the mainstream of American society.
- Maximize the leadership, empowerment, independence, and productivity of individuals with significant disabilities; and
- Promote the integration and full inclusion of individuals with significant disabilities into the mainstream of American society.

1.4 Evaluation

Methods and processes the Statewide Independent Living Council will use to evaluate the effectiveness of the State Plan for Independent Living including timelines and evaluation of satisfaction of individuals with disabilities.

The Indiana Statewide Independent Living Council (INSILC) will employ a variety of mechanisms to monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the State Plan for Independent Living (SPIL) and the satisfaction of individuals with disabilities.

Process of Evaluation of Plan Goals and Objectives

The State Plan for Independent Living Committee of Indiana Statewide Independent Living Council (INSILC) will review progress towards the stated goals and objectives of the Plan a minimum of twice per year. This review will be performed during an open meeting of the Committee, allowing for public comment. Upon completion of the Committee’s review, the progress will be reported to the full Council and the Centers for Independent Living.

After a review has taken place, should the Committee find improvements or changes that need to be made, identify new barriers to the implementation of the Plan, concerns stemming from public input, or other reasons that require further action, the Committee shall engage one or more of the following actions:

- Create a Plan to address the issue(s) or concern(s).
- Refer the issue(s) to another Indiana Statewide Independent Living Council Committee for additional review and discussion.
- Create a workgroup to address issues and/or concerns.
- Recommend revision(s) of the Plan to the full Council.
- Hold public forums to gather public feedback.
- Contact the Administration for Community Living for guidance.

Annually, a year-end progress report will inform the Council, Centers for Independent Living, consumers, stakeholders, and other members of the public about the progress made towards the goals of the Plan. The report will include highlights of notable accomplishments, lessons learned, and the overall progress towards the achievement of the stated goals and objectives.

The evaluation section with the remainder of the full State Plan for Independent Living document will be finalized and available for public comment once the Goals, Objectives, and Indicators are updated after receiving public comments on May 9th & 13th, 2024.
